OVERHAULING THE HONDURAS ROAD FUND

CoST – the Infrastructure Transparency Initiative (CoST)

is the leading global initiative improving infrastructure transparency and accountability. Since CoST Honduras joined the initiative in 2014, it has seen significant impact at both a project and sectoral level. Below is one example of this impact.

ROAD MANAGEMENT IN HONDURAS

The Road Fund (Fondo Vial) was the public body responsible for maintaining Honduras's 14,000 km network of roads. It had suffered from a lack of accountability and poor management, with repercussions on quality and safety.

WHAT WERE THE KEY ISSUES?



The Road Fund had become **politicised** and money was assigned based on political allegiances rather than community needs. There were rumored links to organised crime

US\$ 112 million / 2700m Lempiras was invested in the Road Fund between

2014-2017, when CoST showed it to be consistently underperforming and disclosing incomplete project data



DISCLOSURE

Disclosing data on public infrastructure projects allows citizens to hold decision makers to account. Since 2015, Honduras has been disclosing infrastructure data on the online platform, SISOCS, which was developed by the Government of Honduras with support from CoST Honduras and the World Bank. Alarm bells were raised when the Road Fund failed to disclose key data in accordance with the CoST Infrastructure Data Standard which requires 40 data points to be published at key stages of the project cycle.


THE RESULT
